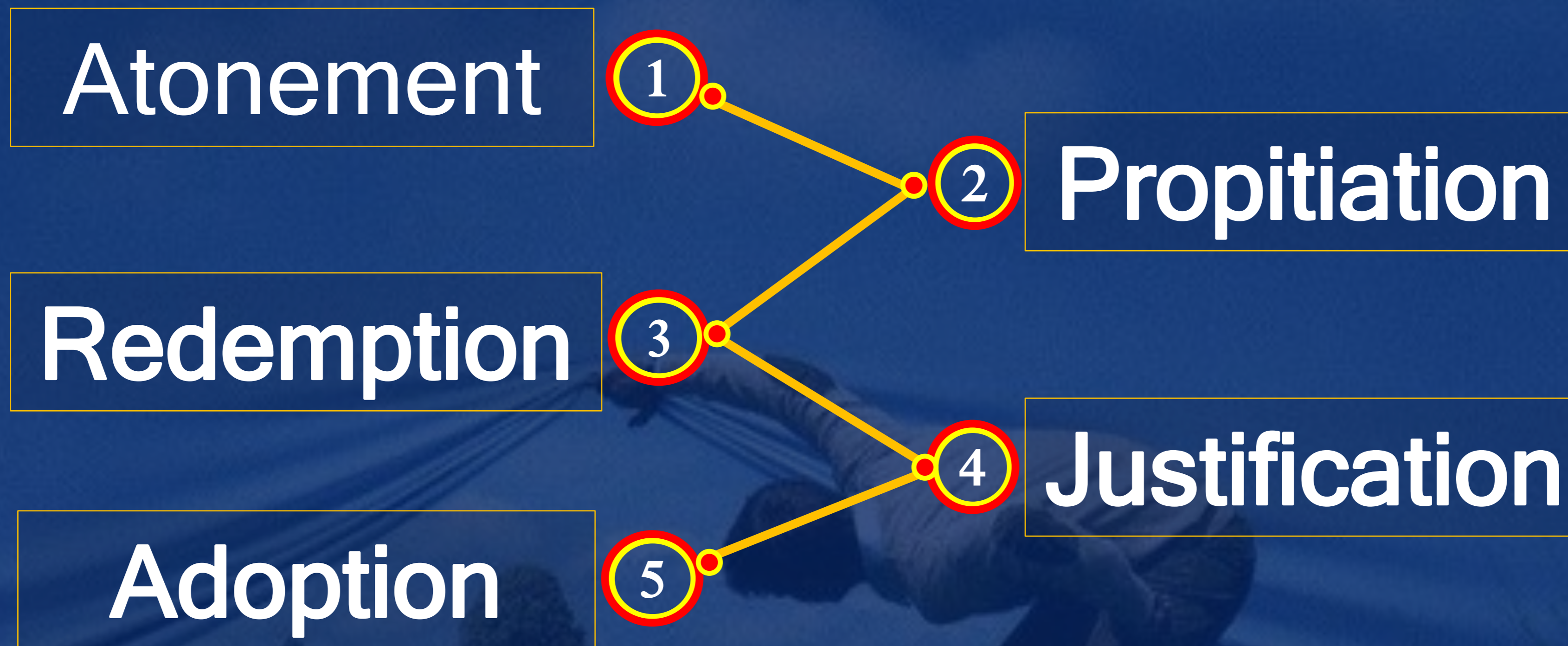


② The paradox of the Lord's servant
